**SCHOOL UNIFORM AND EQUIPMENT – 2008-2009**

It is the policy of the School to encourage the wearing of school uniform. This helps to give the children a pride in their appearance through an identity with the school. It also provides an acceptable form of clothing which is available from a wide range of shops and stores and the School. Items of good quality second hand uniform can be purchased from the School Office at reasonable prices.

**Winter Uniform – Second half of Autumn term and Spring term**

**Girls**

- Grey skirt or grey tunic or grey tailored trousers
- White school shirt (long sleeved buttoned at neck)
- School tie
- School sweatshirt or cardigan
- Hair bands – plain navy blue, yellow, white or black.
- White socks/black or navy tights in winter
- Sensible dark coloured shoes (not boots or trainers)

**Boys**

- Grey long trousers – no decorative/sewn-on pockets
- White school shirt (long sleeved buttoned at neck and not of the polo type)
- School tie
- School sweatshirt
  
- Grey socks
- Sensible black coloured shoes (not boots or trainers)

**Summer Uniform - Summer term and first half of Autumn term**

**Girls**

- Navy blue/white check summer dress  
**or**
- White short sleeved school shirt which may be worn with or without a tie and grey skirt, grey tunic or grey trousers.  
All short sleeve shirts must have collars, be able to button at the neck and be suitable for wearing with a tie on formal occasions.
- White socks
- Hair bands – plain navy blue, yellow, white or black or blue/white checked hairbands to match summer school dress.
- 
- Sensible dark coloured shoes (not boots, trainers or ballet pump style)

**Boys**

- Grey shorts or grey long trousers – no decorative/sewn-on pocket
- White short sleeved school shirt which may be worn with or without a tie.  
All short sleeve shirts must have collars, be able to button at the neck and be suitable for wearing with a tie on formal occasions.
- Grey socks
  
- Sensible black coloured shoes (not boots or trainers)

**Please note:**

Trainers/boots are not acceptable as normal footwear in school  
Outdoor shoes/trainers are required for outdoor play at break times

## **PE/Games Kit - Girls and Boys**

### **Indoor**

- Navy school polo shirt
- Plain navy blue shorts – no stripes or logos

### **Outdoor**

- Navy school polo shirt
- Plain navy blue shorts
- Plimsolls/sensible trainers
- Plain navy tracksuit (see below) – no stripes or logos
- Football boots are optional (football club team members require them)

- School tie (only available **through the School** at a cost of £2.50 – not available online).
- Navy Blue school sweatshirt or cardigan (with school and logo);
- Navy Blue polo shirt with school logo.

- PE/Shoe Bags/Swimming Bags
- Navy Blue school baseball cap (embroidered with school name and logo);

### **Other Equipment**

Pritt Sticks and handwriting pens are available to buy from the school office.

### **Tracksuits**

Plain navy blue tracksuits, although not essential, may be worn for outside lessons in cold weather.

### **Clothing with any form of stripes, logos or markings are not permitted.**

If a tracksuit is not worn for outside activities then a thick navy blue jumper is needed as games are played all year round and your child will be expected to participate.

### **Protective Clothing**

Some form of protective clothing is desirable for craft and painting lessons and for home economics. An old shirt is an excellent form of protective clothing and although we have some in school it is more desirable if children have their own. The school cannot be held responsible for spoilt or damaged clothing.

### **Personal Labels**

It would be greatly appreciated if all clothing and personal articles were marked with the child's name. We do our best to protect property but, again, the school cannot be responsible for lost or mislaid articles of clothing or possessions which can be expensive to replace.

### **Jewellery**

Watches may be worn, as may stud type earrings, both of these must be removed before any physical activity e.g. PE, games, swimming. The care of such items is the responsibility of the pupil. Please ensure that if you wish your child to have their ears pierced this is done during the summer holiday so as to cause minimum disruption to your child's participation in the school curriculum.

### **Hair**

For health, safety and hygiene reasons hair longer than shoulder length must be tied back at all times.
