HOME/SCHOOL/PUPIL AGREEMENT

Long Ditton St Mary's School is a Voluntary Aided Church of England Junior School, which is part of a wider Christian family. Our school benefits greatly from strong links with St Mary's, our local Parish Church, and the support of the Guildford Diocesan Board of Education.

As set out in the Mission Statement in the School Prospectus, Christian values are at the heart of all that we do. At Long Ditton St Mary's we believe that successful partnership between the church, the school, the parents and the pupils help each child to take full advantage of all that the school has to offer. The following agreement supports this partnership in the interest of our children.

The School will try to:

- care for your child's safety and happiness;
- ensure that your child achieves his/her full potential as a valued member of the school community;
- provide a balanced curriculum and meet the individual needs of your child;
- achieve high standards of work and behaviour from pupils through building good relationships and developing a sense of responsibility;
- be open and welcoming at all times and offer opportunities for you to become involved in the daily life of the school;
- keep you informed on progress via open evenings, newsletters, regular contact;
- ensure pupils' homework diaries are filled in accurately, comments checked if necessary and signed weekly.

I/We shall try to:

- make sure my child arrives at school on time, but not later than 8.45am;
- see that my child goes to school regularly and will provide a note of explanation if he/she is absent (a phone call is required on the first day of absence);
- ensure that at all times he/she is properly equipped;
- make the school aware of any concerns or problems that might affect my child's work or behaviour (this may be done through the pupil's homework diary, a short memo or

verbally at an agreed time with the child's teacher or headteacher);

- Ensure my child has adequate sleep and breakfast in order to maximise learning;
- support the school's policies and guidelines for behaviour;
- support my child in homework as outlined in the School's Homework Policy and other opportunities for home-learning;
- check my child's homework diary, make comments if necessary and sign this weekly.
- attend parents' evenings and discussions about my child's progress;
- get to know about my child's life at the school and participate when appropriate in events which support the school;
